CPD for professionals


Workshop support for parents

As a team, we are dedicated to reducing Violence Against Women and Girls which is why we run the VAWG Education Network Meeting and created the SqUp ABC Behaviour Change Programme for Young People.

## Why is Early Intervention important?

Providing timely support is vital. Identifying and addressing a child or family's needs early on can increase protective factors that positively influence a child's wellbeing, and decrease risk factors that may be impacting a child's life negatively.

It is our unique experiences of life that determine how we see and move through the world.

This unique lived experience forms our perceptions about life. We may think that we're open-minded and not easily influenced by others but we actually see the world through our own very narrow viewpoint.

This is the same for the young people we work with. We must help them to see beyond their own viewpoint and to see the how their identity impacts on their thoughts, feelings and ultimately actions.


**Contextual Safeguarding** is an approach to understand and respond to young people's experience of harm in contexts outside of the family setting.



Children often don't see themselves as victims or realise they have been groomed to get involved in criminality.

As professionals, we have a duty of care to keep all children safe from harm.





### Analyse Attitudes

The first stage of the programme is to explore the attitudes and beliefs that the young males hold about women.




#### **Break Behaviours**


Once they have a chance to acknowledge their attitudes and beliefs, we look to support the young males to see how those attitudes affect the way they behave towards women.

### Create Challenge

Then finally, we look how how they can challenge themselves and others to end violence against women and girls.



Our Squaring Up Packages are unique modules that are designed to *equip pupils with a sound understanding of risk and the knowledge and skills necessary to make safe and informed decisions.*

# What is it?

The Rainbow Flag Award is a national quality assurance framework, with a focus on positive LGBT+ inclusion, for all schools and youth organisations.

Piloted in 2016-2019, thanks to funding from the Government Equalities Office (via the DfE).

Works as a framework for those at starting point of LGBT+ inclusion, as well as those wanting recognition for work already happening.

Is not prescriptive!

A collaborate project between local LGBT+ youth orgs.



## What does it involve?

Supporting schools to engage in a year-long process, taking a whole-organisation approach to LGBT+ inclusion, across six key areas:

## What it costs:

## £795 Primary Schools £995 Secondary Schools £1295 All Through Schools

- Two places on LGBT+ inclusion starter training course
- Access to the Members' Area of the Rainbow Flag Award website (The Rainbow Flag Award Classroom, LGBT+ Library and Best Practice Examples)
- Access to evidence reviews during the year, where you will receive detailed and constructive feedback on evidence you submit for each of the six Rainbow Flag Award sections.
- Ongoing advice and support via telephone and/or email during the year.
- Resources and opportunities circulated with you.
- 20% off the cost of any additional training, services and resources needed.
- Certificate upon completion.



# What it looks like for you:

- New cohorts start each term September, January and May
- Receive starter training in first month of the term (for two people), including action planning.
- Submit one section after one term (usually Skilled Teacher is first).
- Submit two sections after two terms (of your choice).
- Submit three sections at end of year cycle (of your choice).
- If completed, your Rainbow Flag Award is valid for a further two years,
   with renewal options at the end of the three year cycle.



"My dad went away over 200 times, and it takes its toll on your mental health, and looking back I just dealt with it, I cried, I got angry, and did all that, but I think it still affects me today."

"School was very hard because no one would talk to you, teachers wouldn't, you would just be there like "Hi" and that was it."

"I would talk about it in school, I would try to educate people in school, I even brought a book into school and read students it trying to teach them about it, but they didn't know anything about it. So, they would take it was a joke - like it wasn't real, but it was real."
