DfE Funding

- Grant of £1200
- Training for Senior Mental Heath Lead (SMHL)
- Develop, and implement, a whole school or college approach to mental health and wellbeing
- Schools and colleges that have taken this approach often report improved attendance, attention, behaviour, and attainment.







Senior Mental Health Lead

- Strategic leadership role
- Oversees the whole school approach
- Creates an open culture where staff and students can discuss their mental health and wellbeing
- Provides support & guidance
- Attends cluster events, shares best practice, and requests for support citywide.







Audit and Action Planning

- 5 Steps to Mental Health and Wellbeing framework
- Evidence based, online, and free
- Enables SMHL (and wider team) to consider their current approach to mental health and wellbeing
- Personalised action plan (Leading Change, Working Together, Understanding Need, Promoting Wellbeing, and Supporting Staff).







Ongoing Support

- Regular meetings with assigned EHO for support & challenge
- Facilitated trust-wide action planning
- Support with planning for wellbeing campaigns
- Access to wider Early Help LA offer
- Early Help Action Meetings or Team Around the School.



Trauma Informed Care Offer



The Hull MHST is keen to support schools with Trauma Informed Care (TIC) approaches. As part of our offer, we have developed a menu of options that demonstrate a graduated offer from a whole school approach perspective.

Trauma informed care recognises the role that adverse childhood experiences can have upon a child's social, emotional and behavioural world. This approach offers a way of making sense of some of the difficulties that our children and young people experience. The approach helps settings to think about adaptations to ways of working to ensure the environment helps our children and young people to meet their potential, feel a sense of belonging and connection and to not be further unfairly disadvantaged due to their past experiences and the impact these can have.

TIC Offer 1 (module 1)



Module 1 'An Introduction to Trauma Informed Care in Education' is online 1.5 hour session introducing the key principles and theory of Trauma Informed Care.

It offers a taster to schools around how we understand what has happened to us rather than what is wrong with us. Introducing the ARC framework, it covers how Trauma Informed Care can begin to be embedded into whole school approaches.

These sessions will be run termly, 3 times a year online.

TIC Offer 2 (modules 1 and 2)



Offer 2 is a whole school, face to face, staff training session, comprising of modules 1 and 2 and totals 3 hours altogether:

Module 1 'An Introduction to Trauma Informed Care in Education'

Module 2 'The role of self-care and staff wellbeing within Trauma Informed Care' This module builds on the understanding and implementation of Trauma Informed Care, and has a strong element of self-care to support staff wellbeing.

TIC Offer 3 (module 3)



Module 3 'Ways of implementing and embedding trauma informed care in education settings'

Module 3 will be offered online (1.5 hours), yearly to begin with, and is only available to those who have already completed modules 1 & 2. The online, bookable training aims to capture key staff from multiple schools who want to think more about practical ways of implementing the theory learnt into their education setting.

TIC Offer 4



Offer 4 is bespoke to the needs of individual educational settings and is a more targeted approach identifying key staff who respond to and support CYP and families.

There is an expectation that all 3 modules will have already been completed prior to requesting Offer 4.

This training will be tailored to the needs of your school/college setting following a whole school approach consultation. This offer includes further ideas and suggestions tailored specifically for the needs of your school. This would focus on ways of further embedding trauma-informed approaches, building on adaptations already made and problem-solving barriers or challenges.




Early Help Family Hubs

Early Help – the Wider Partnership





- Weekly in each locality
- Chaired by myself and other EH Managers
- Refer in via referral pathway and specifically ask to be heard at the EHAM
- Internal processes managed by ourselves
- Referrer will receive and invite and be asked to present
- Attended by a wide range of partners who share information they may have on family, and also solutions
- Lead worker is the most appropriate team




